Note on pronunciation of “ture,” “tue,” “tu,” “du,” and “sure.”

These patterns, found in the examples “structure,” “statue,” “eventual,” “graduate,” and “insure,” sound, to our ear, like this:

struc ture
sta tue
e ven tu al
gra du ate
in sure

struc cher
sta choo
e ven choo al
gra joo ate
in sher

which would require t=ch and ure=er
which would require t=ch
which would require t=ch
which would require d=j
which would require ure=er

Now, these *could* be taught as new code options, but it is more efficient to teach a *perfect pronunciation* of each of these using the /ue/ sound because every example then falls into a situation already included in a normal phonics curriculum, as shown here:

struc ture
sta tue
e ven tu al
gra du ate
in sure

struc t/ue/r
sta t/ue/
e ven t/ue/ al
gra d/ue/ ate
in sh/ue/r

(All of these should be *perfectly pronounced* but then the child should be shown how saying them quickly causes each to sound somewhat differently, e.g., sta-t/ue/ starts to sound like sta-choo. Students accept this, and it helps their recall for spelling as well.)
